G is for Gulfstream — luxury wings for long trips.

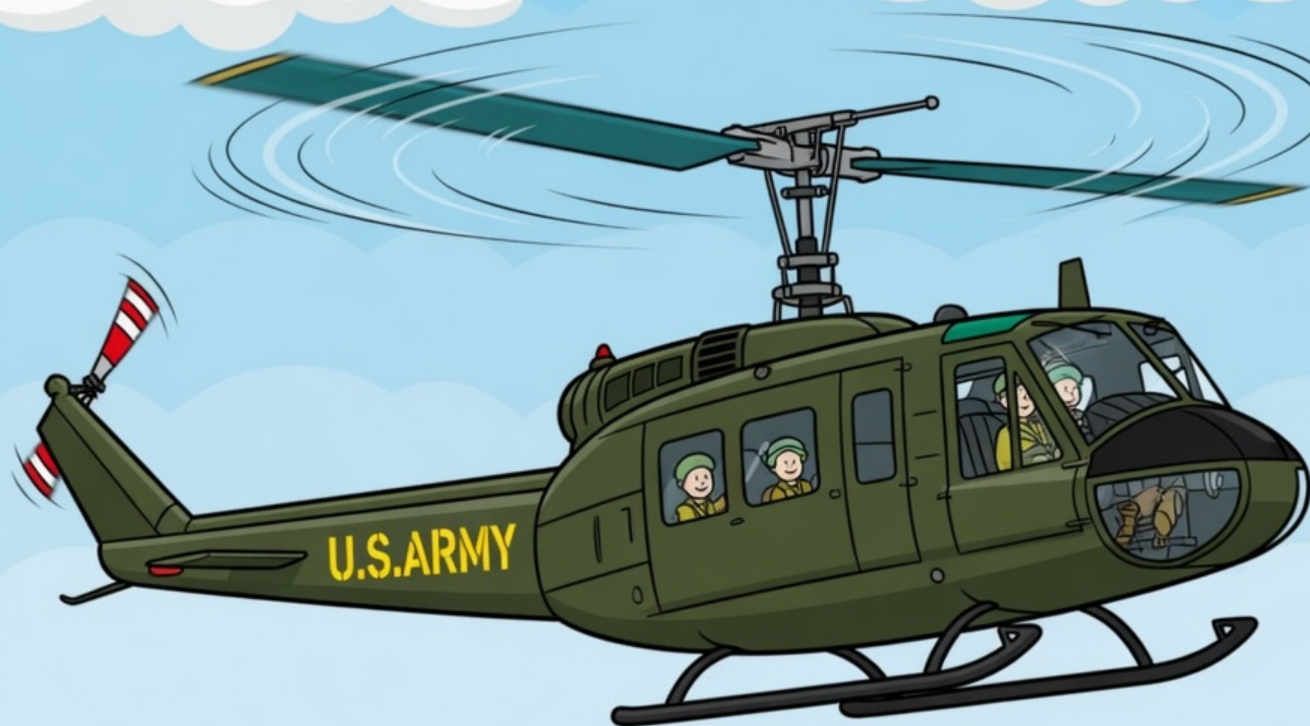
H
