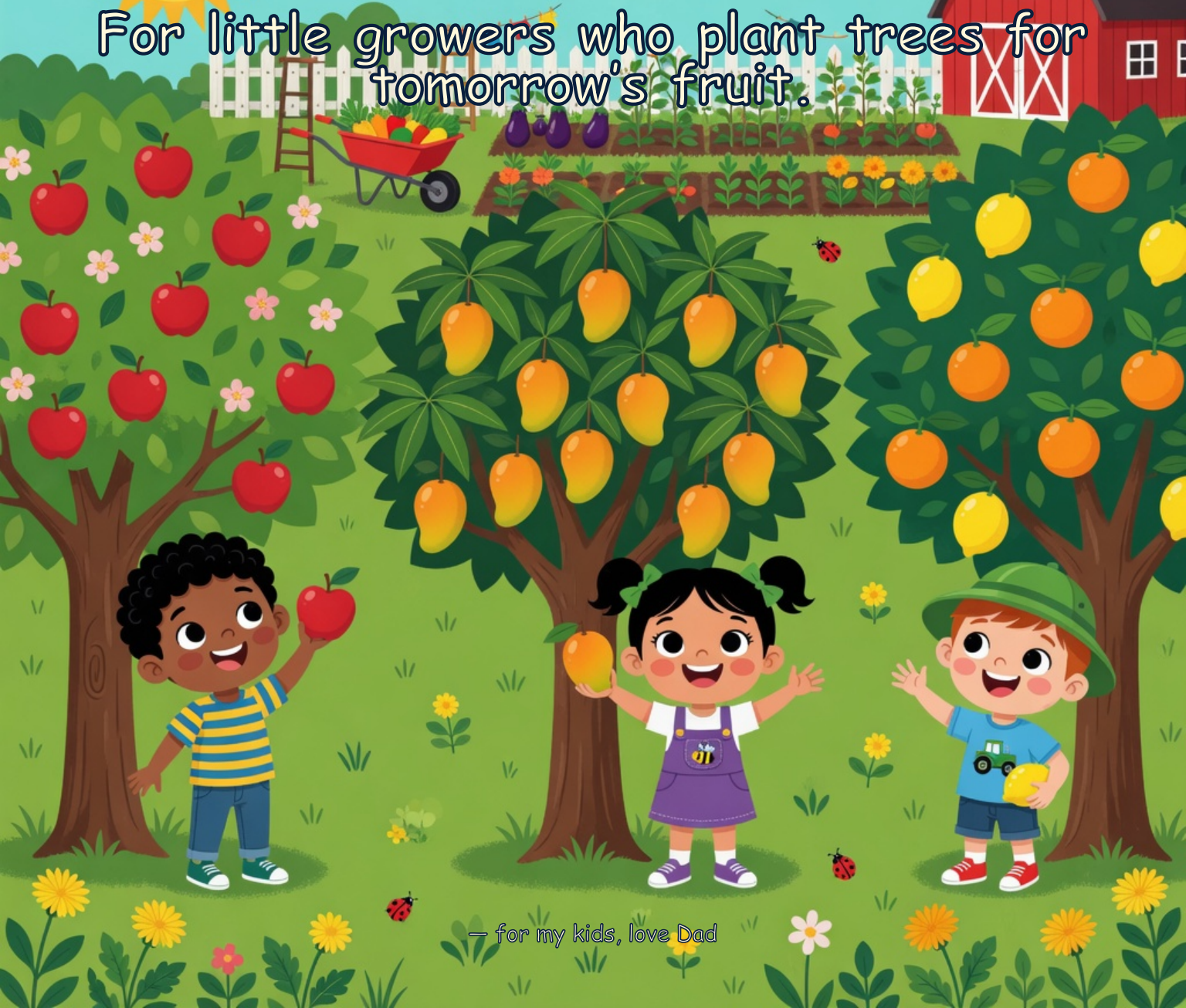




Fruit Tree ABCs

E is for Eggfruit

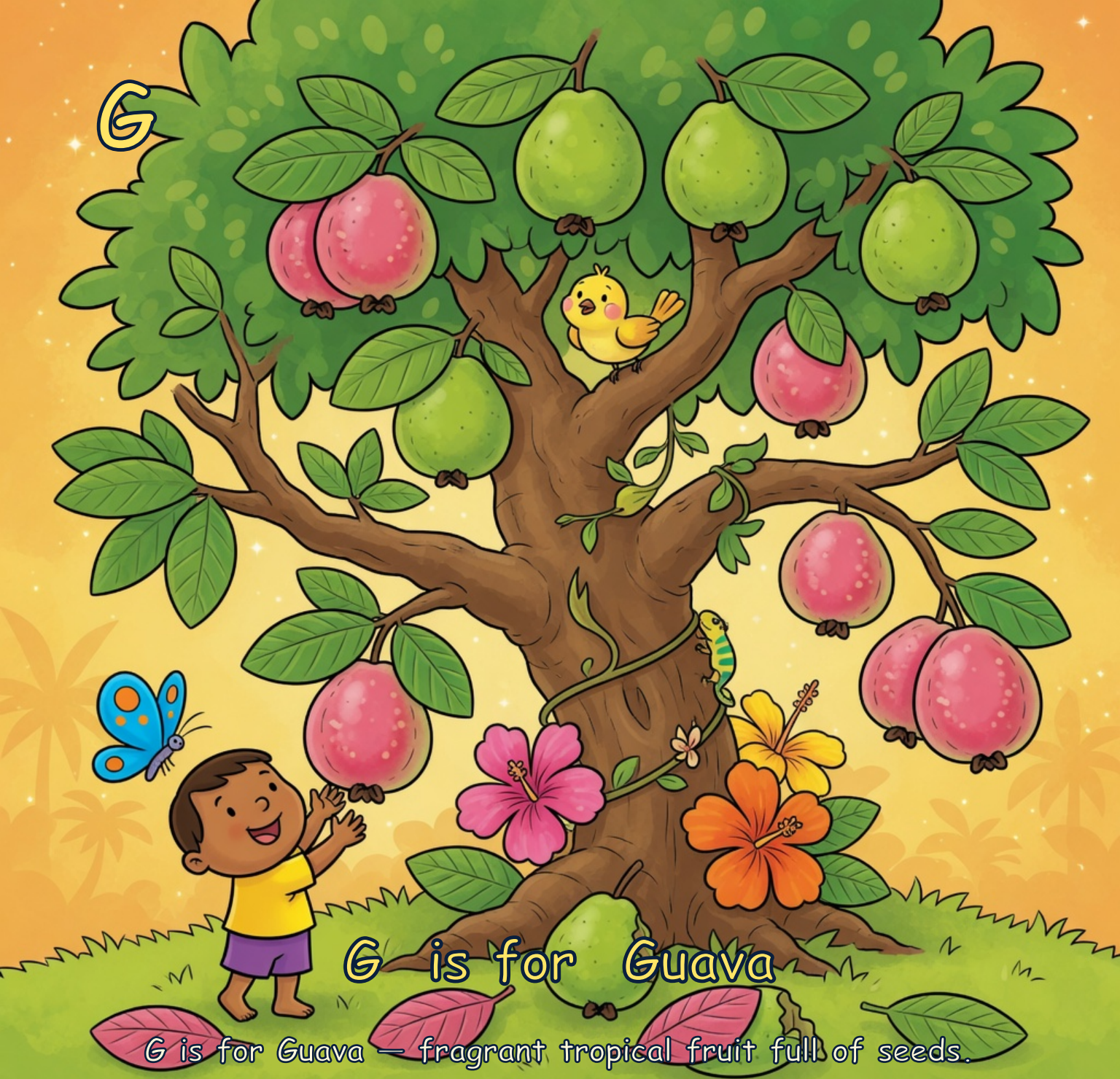
E is for Eggfruit — a tropical tree with creamy yellow fruit.

F is for Fig — soft sweet fruit on a friendly shade tree.



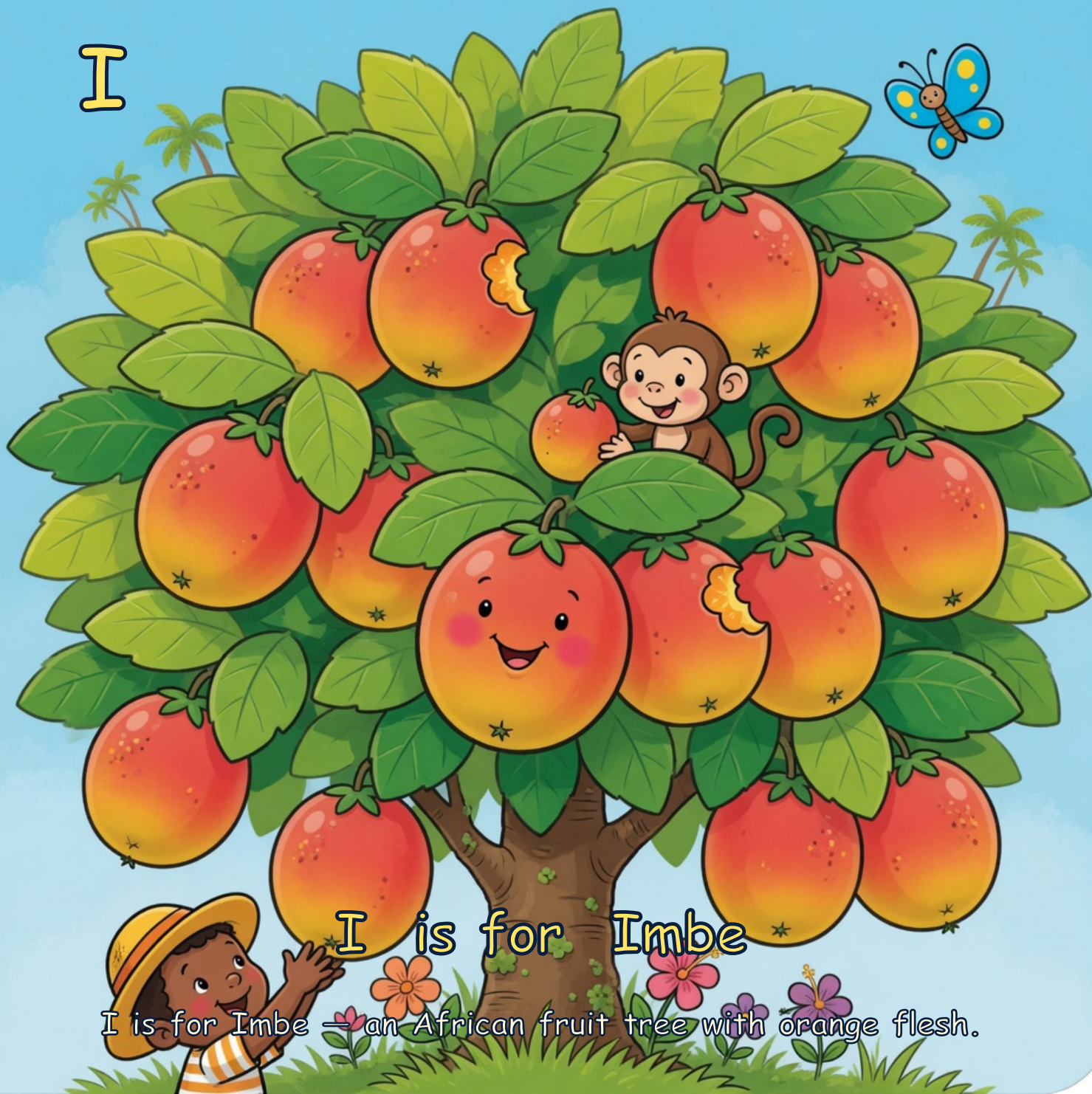
H

O is for Olive — trees that give oil and salty fruit.



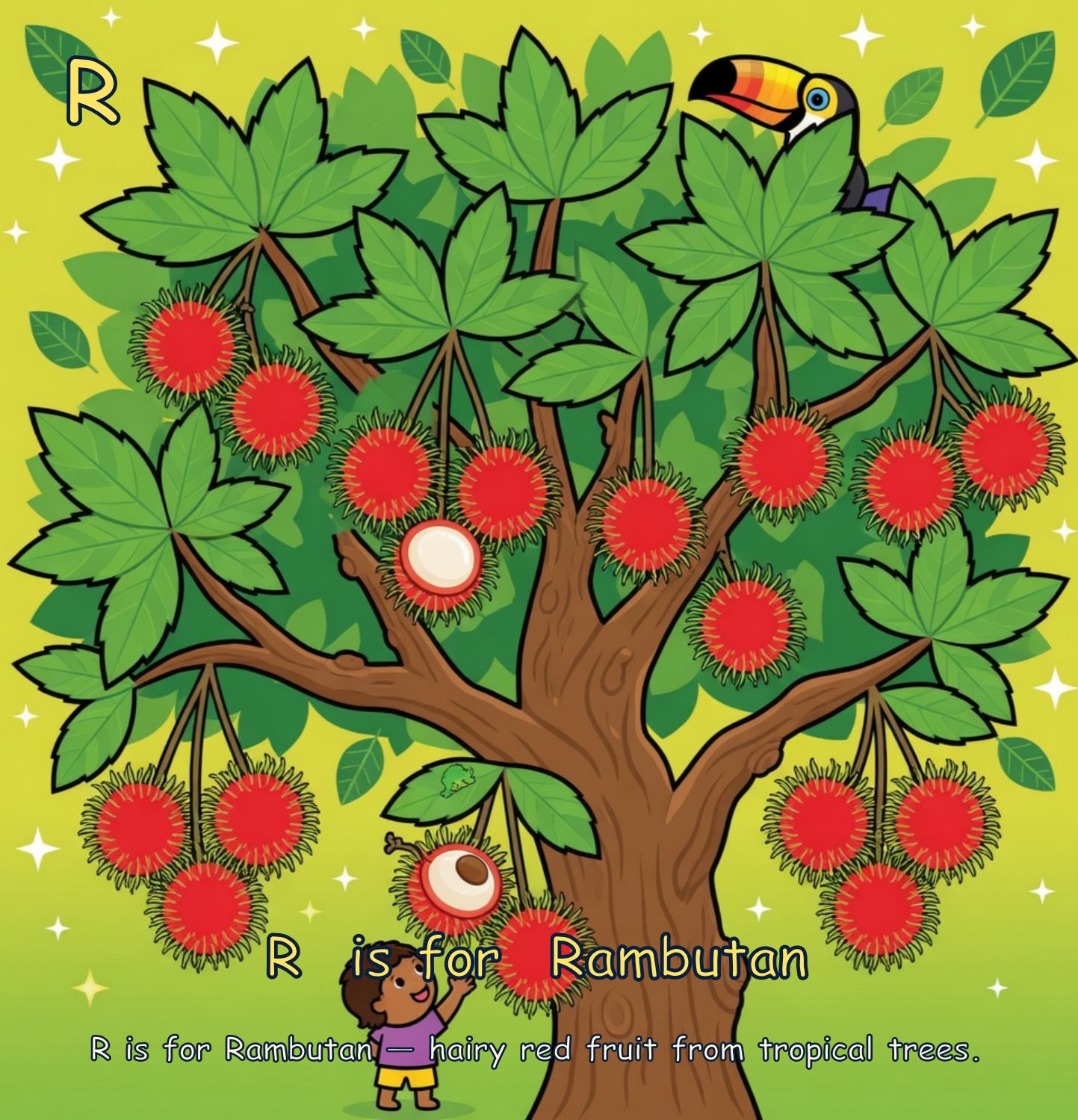
P is for Peach

V is for Velvet apple — fuzzy purple tropical fruit.

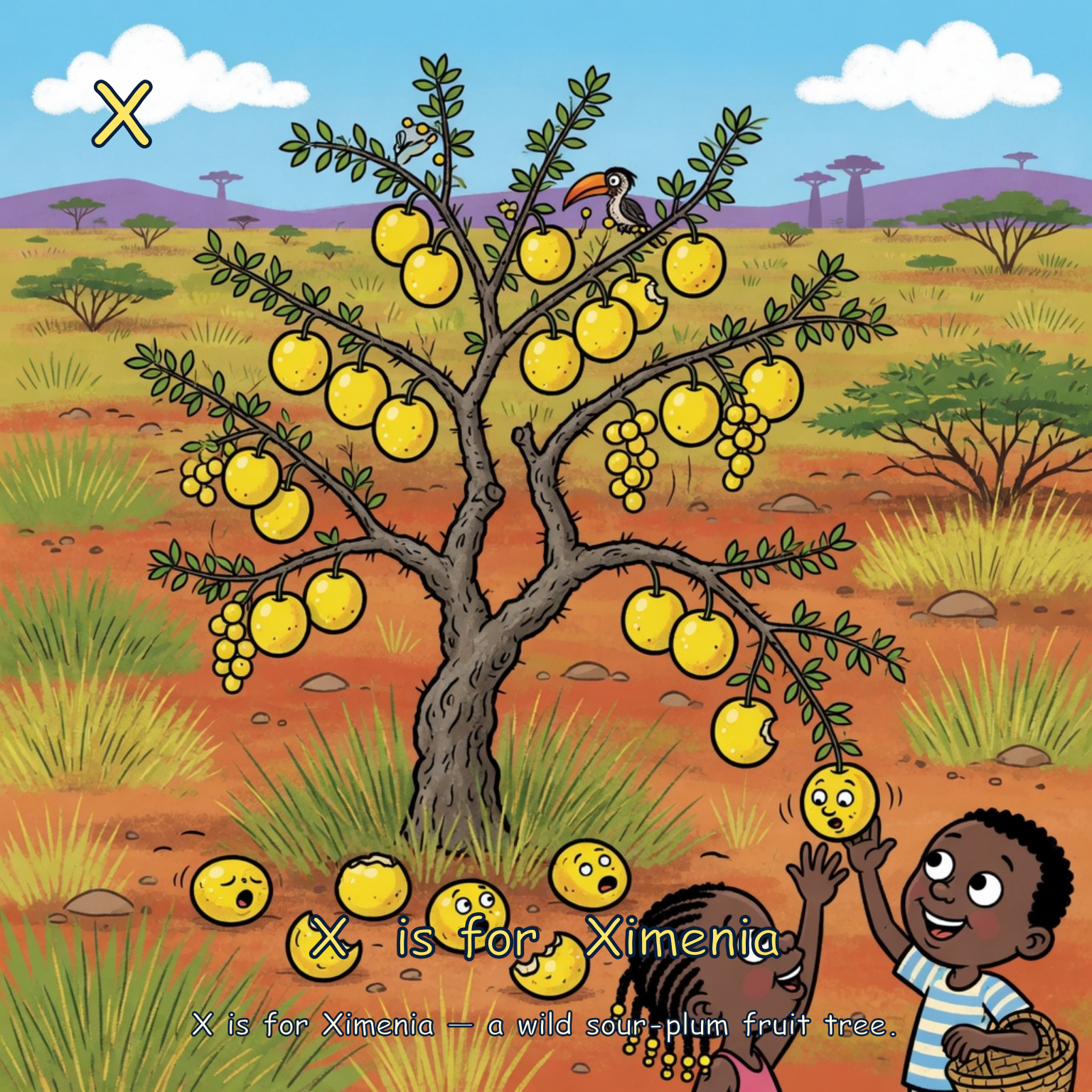
W
