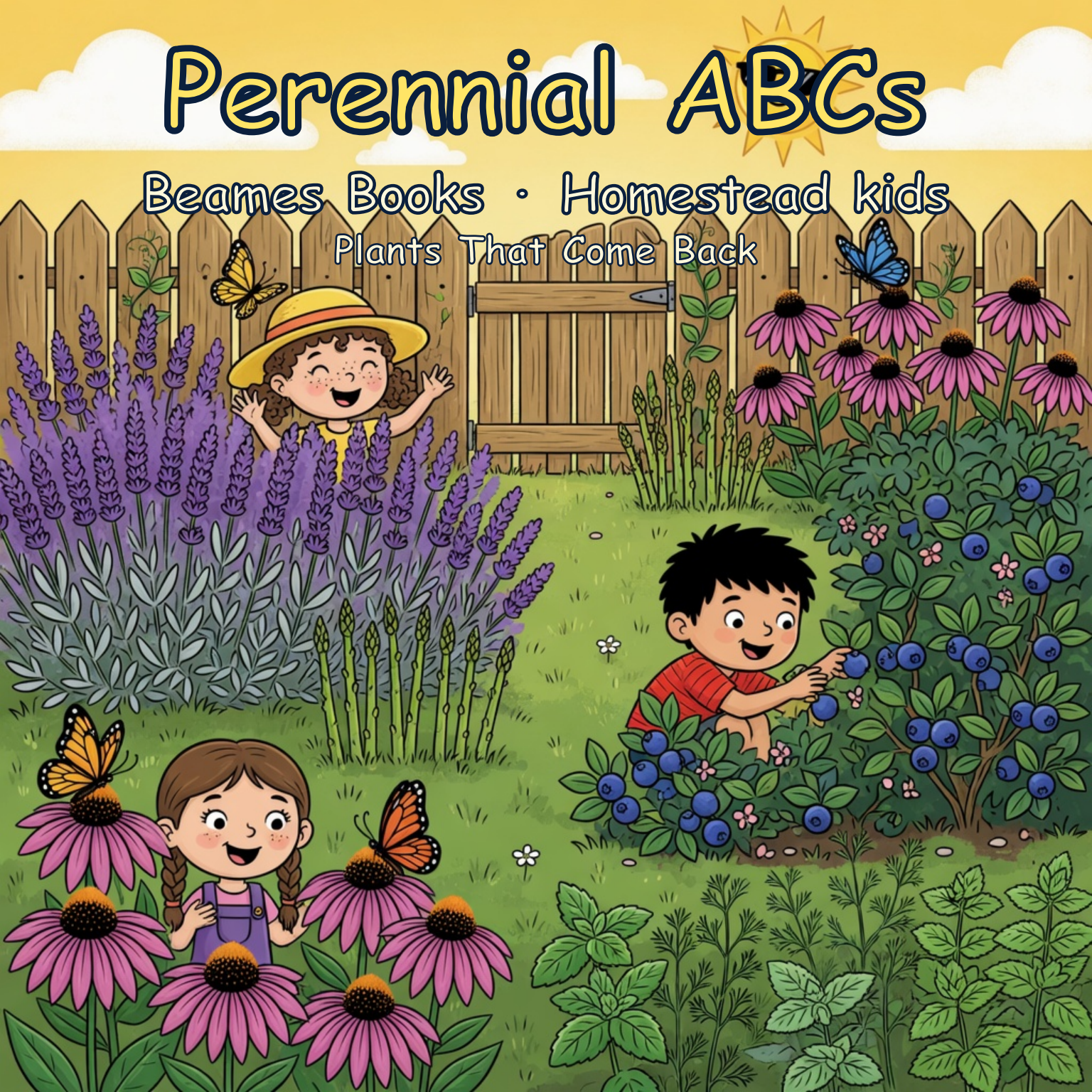

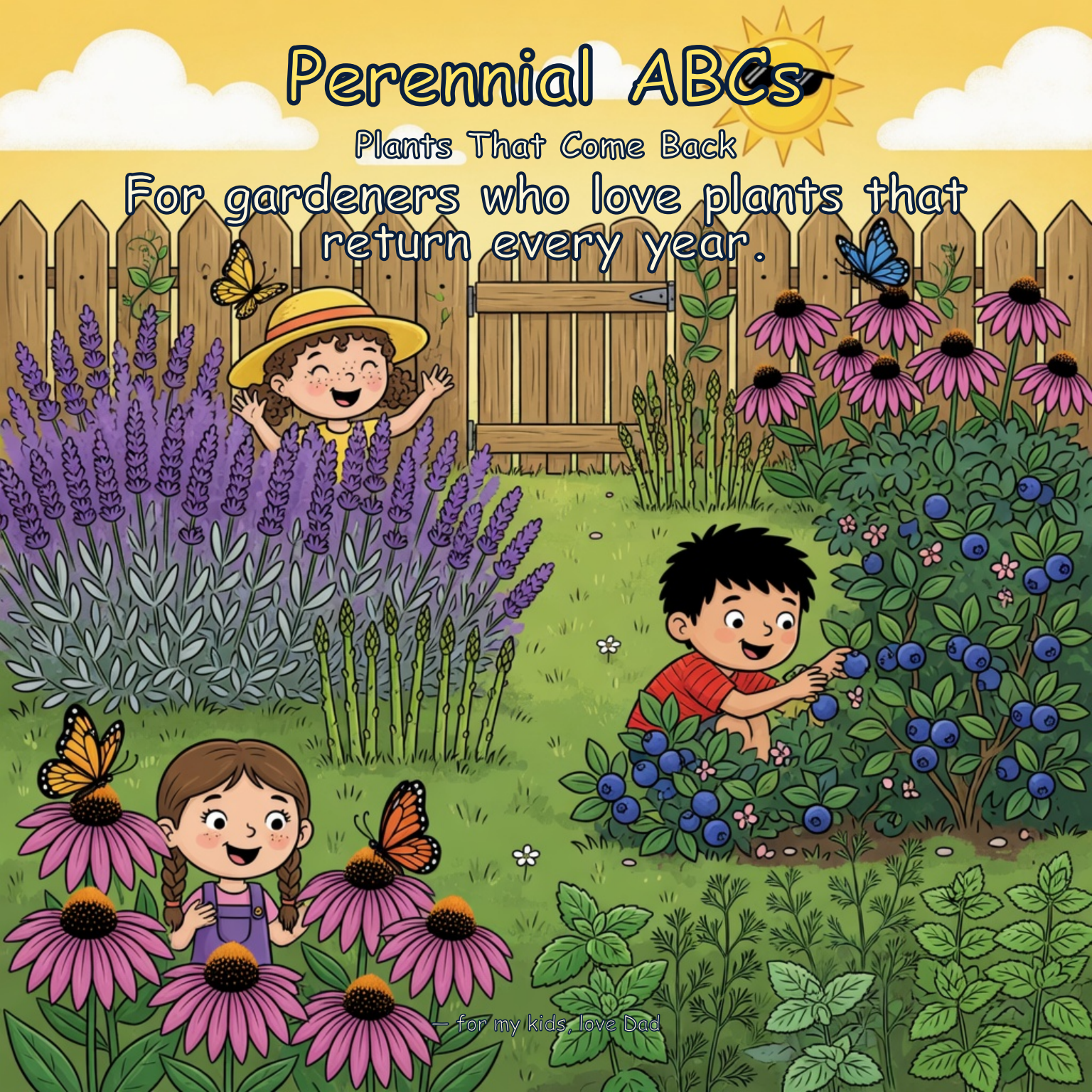

A is for Asparagus

F is for Fennel — feathery perennial with licorice flavor.

H is for Horseradish — hot roots that come back yearly.

I is for Indigo — perennial plants that dye cloth blue.

J



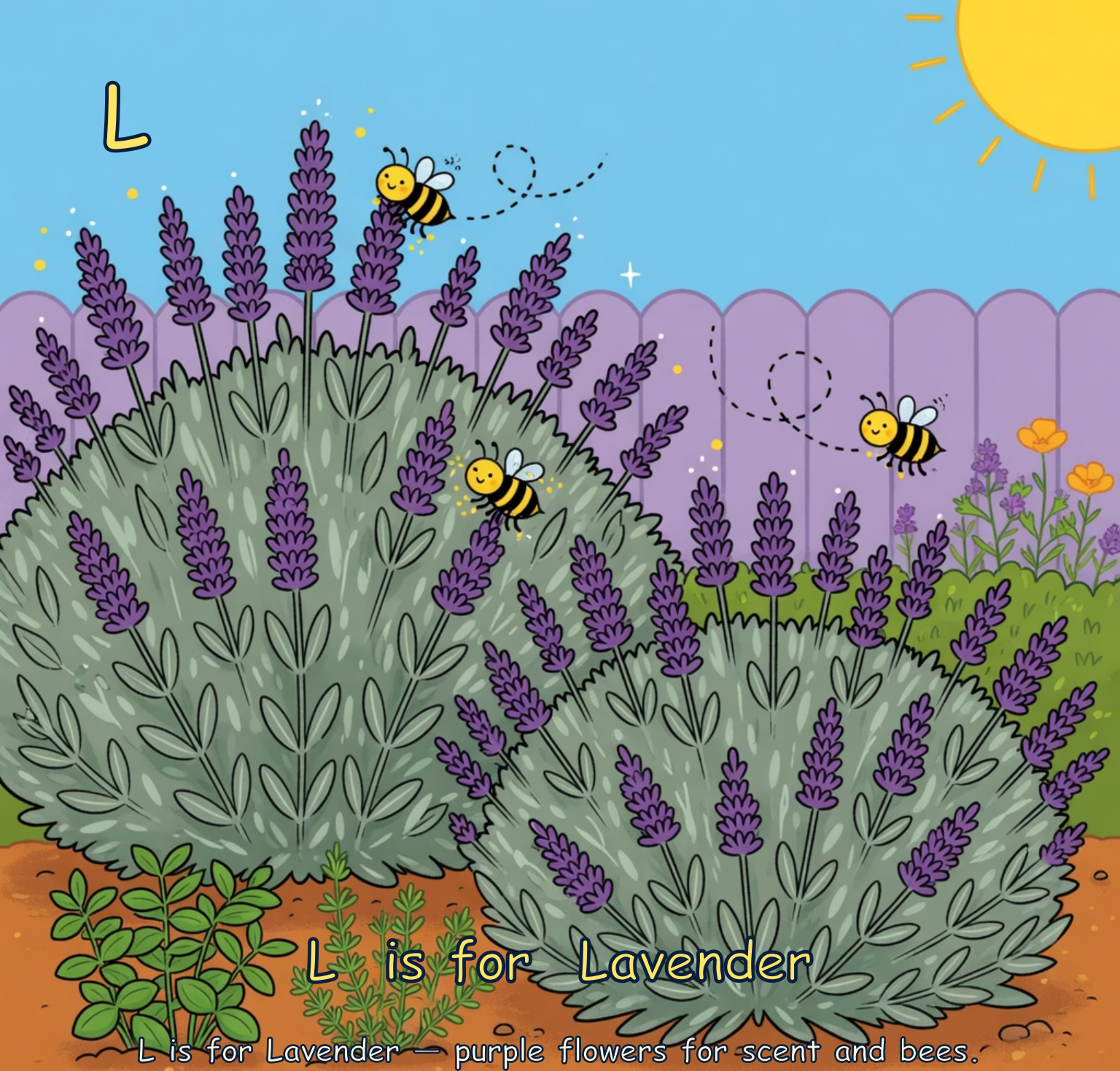
J is for Jerusalem artichoke

P is for Peppermint — mint with a strong cool kick.

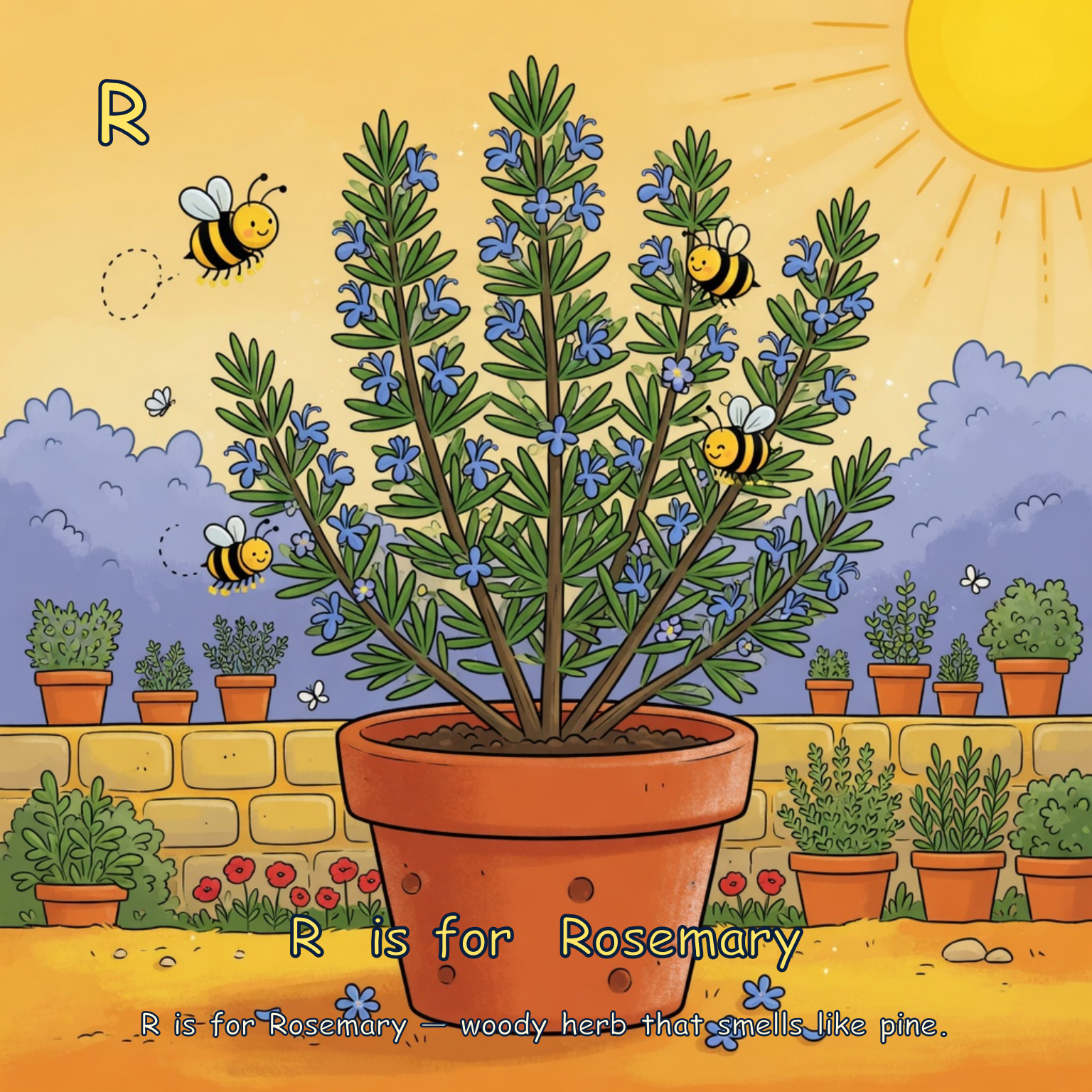

T is for Thyme

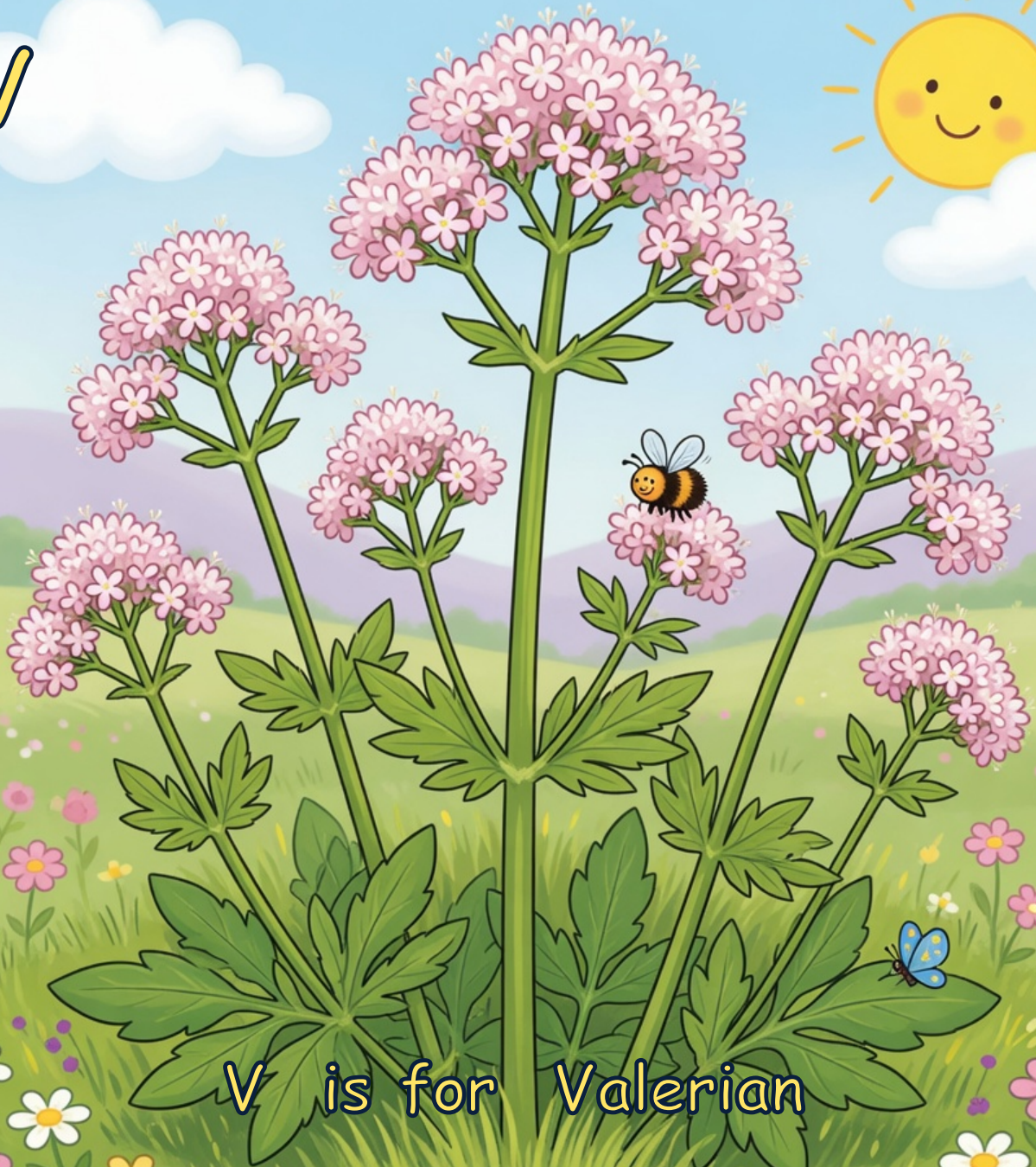
T is for Thyme — tiny leaves packed with flavor.

U is for Upland cress — peppery greens year after year.

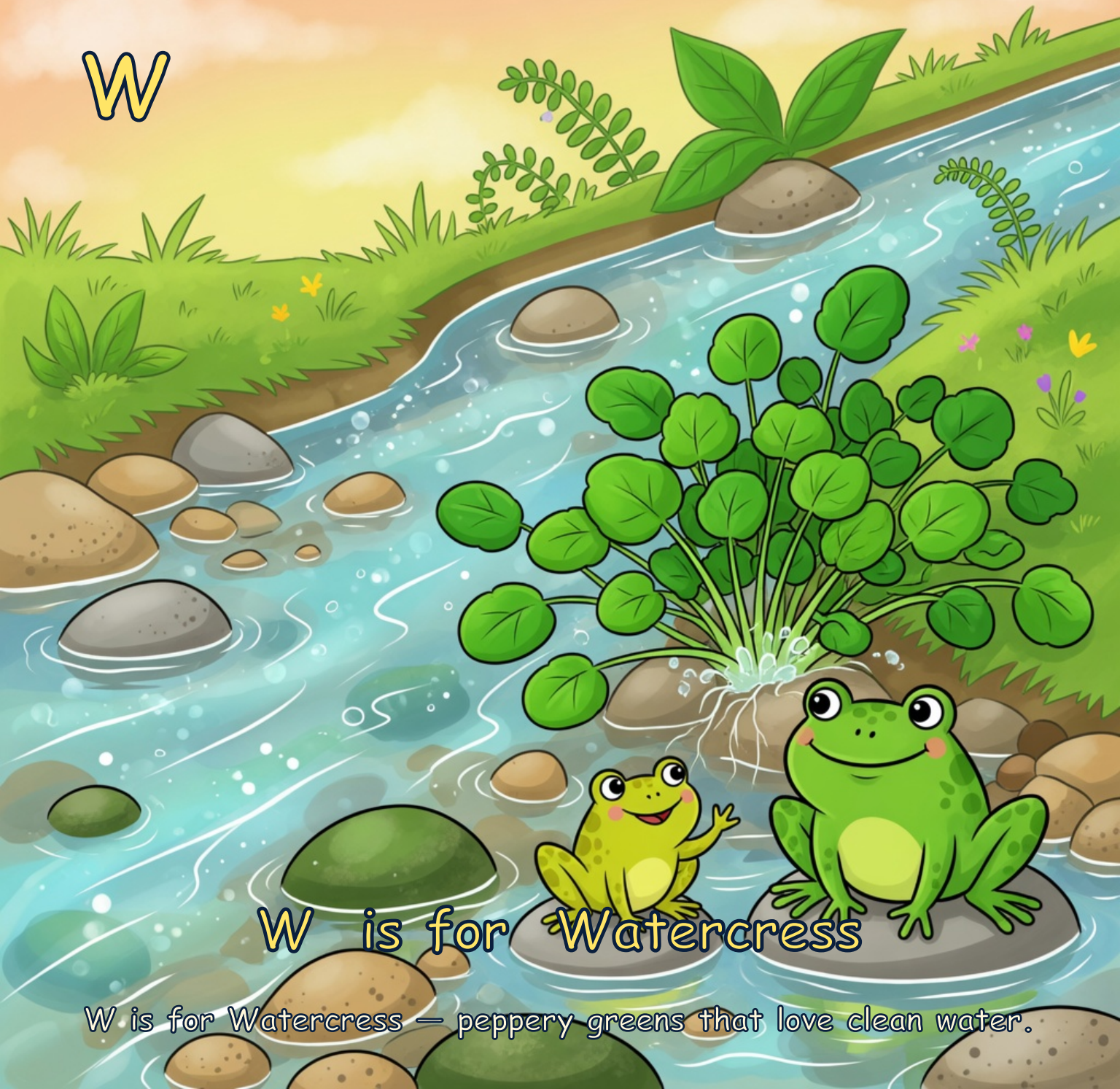
V

Z

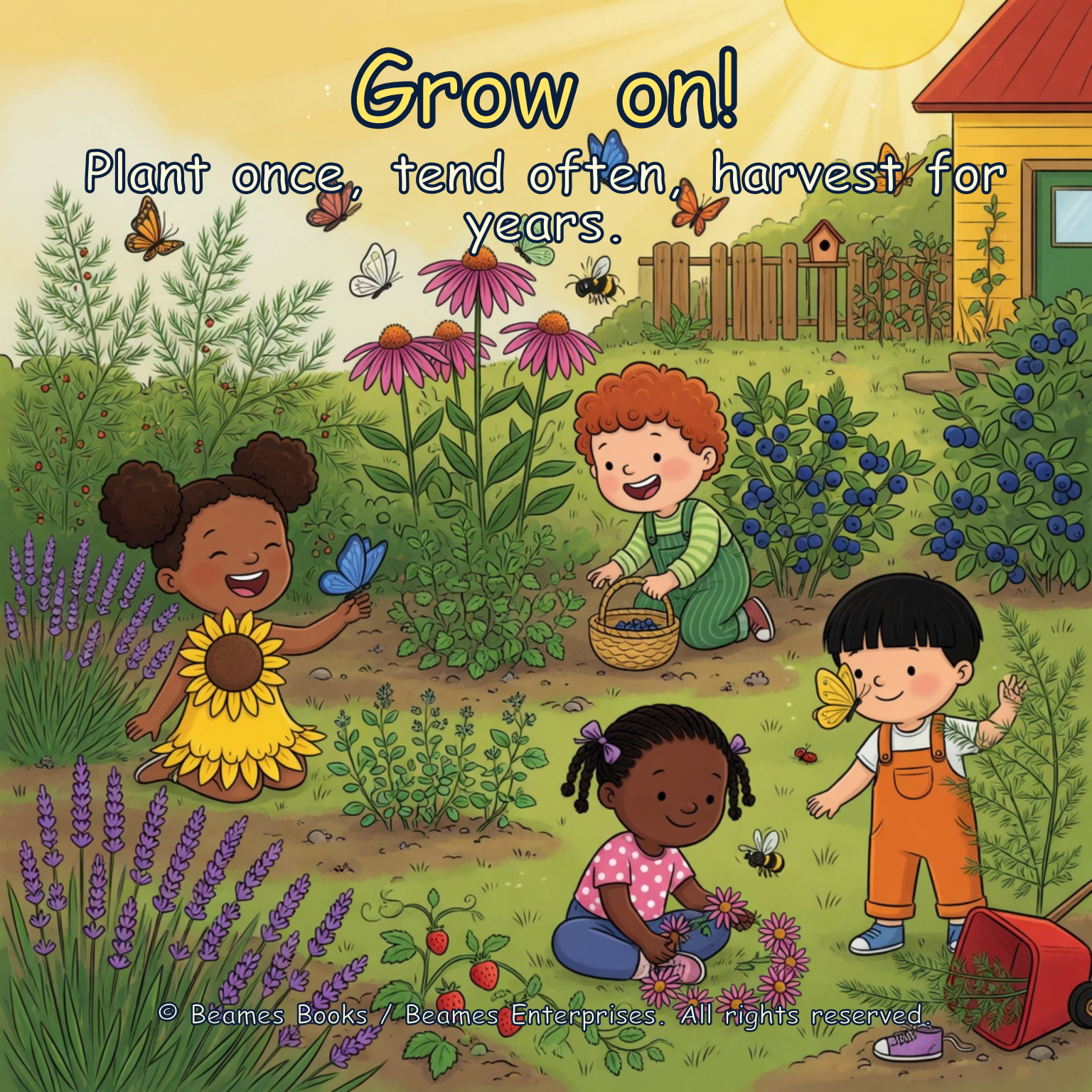


Z is for Zedoary
