J is for Jacket

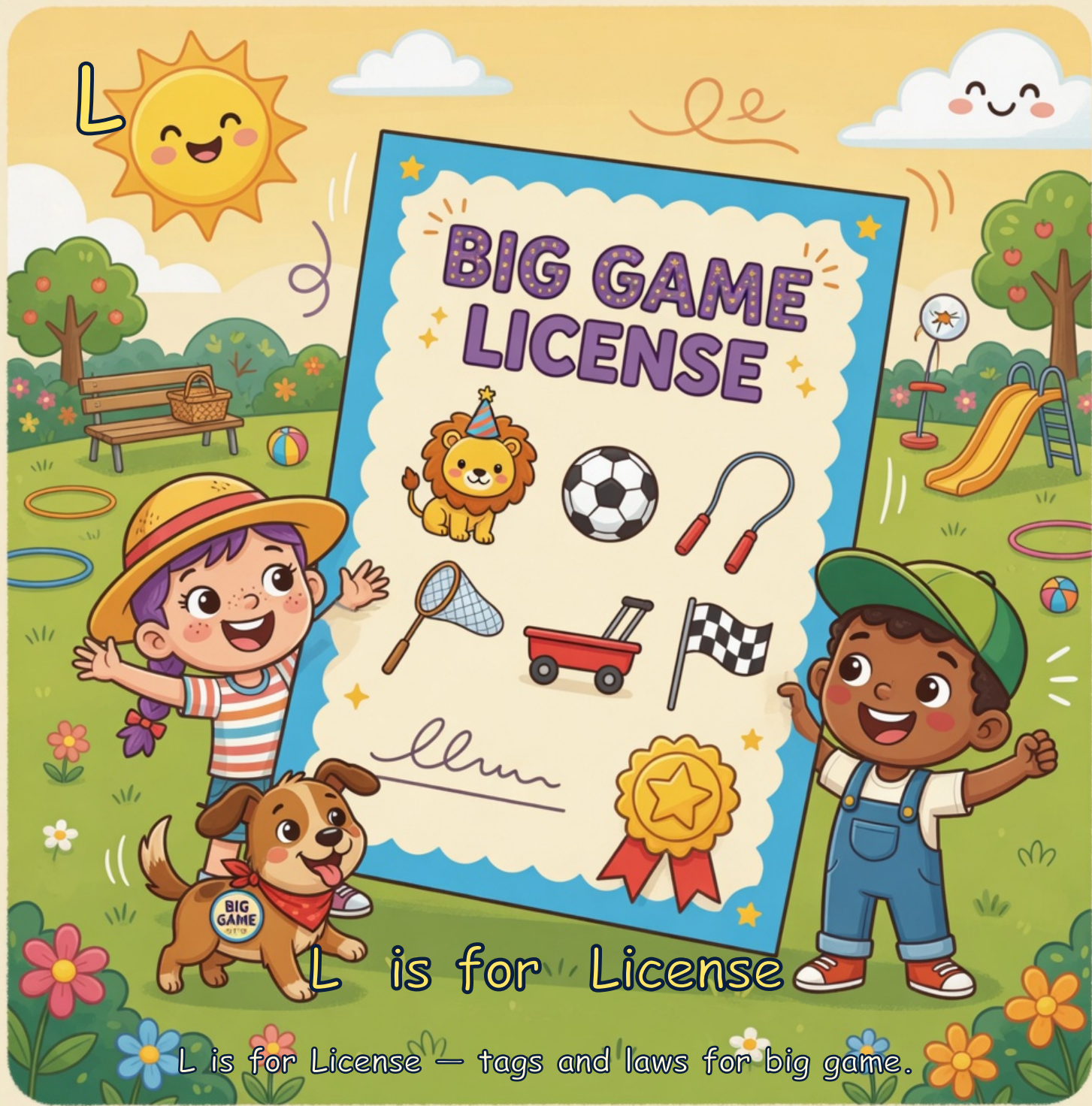
J is for Jacket — layers for cold mountain mornings.

K



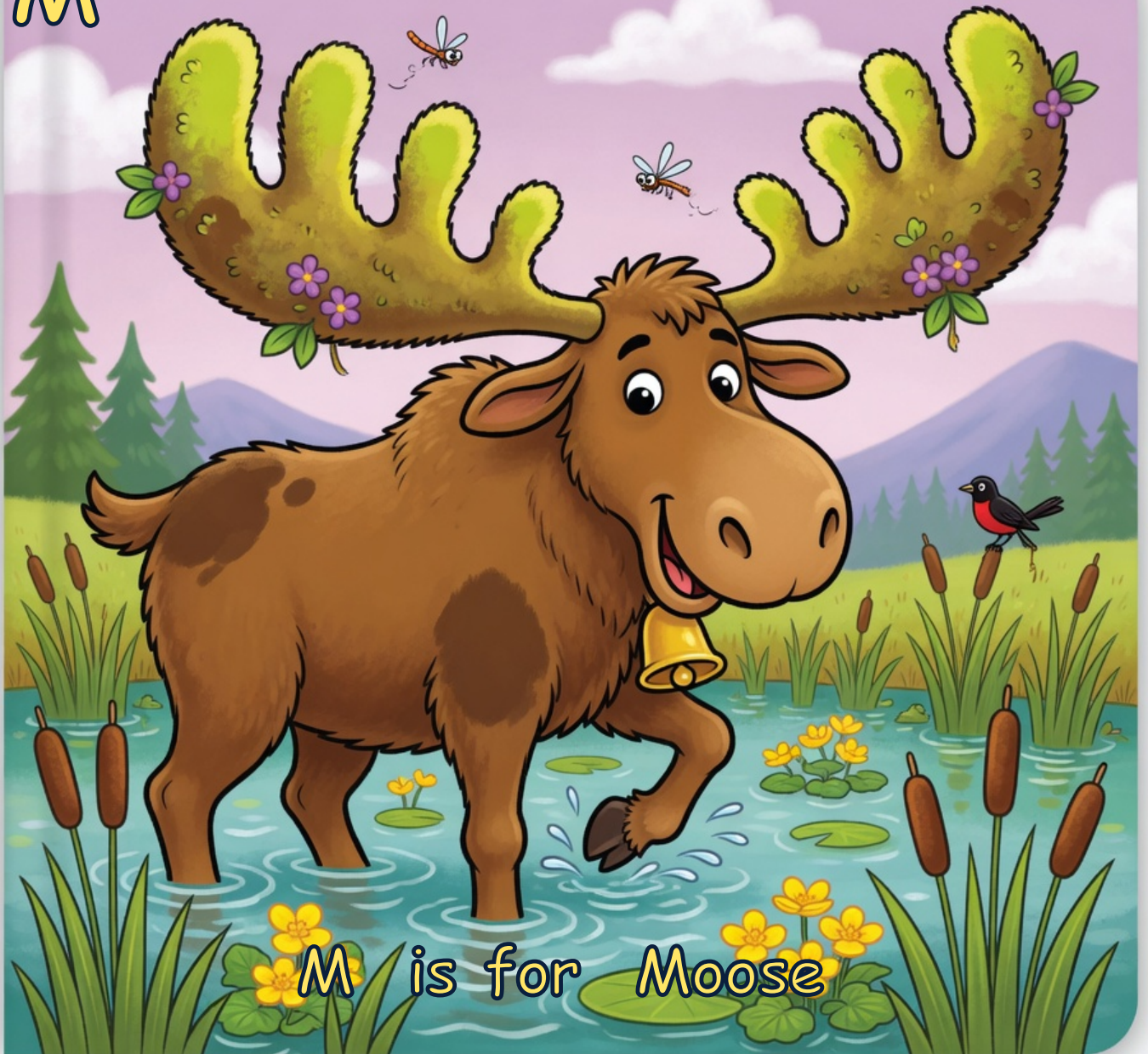
K is for Knife
